# SYDNEY UNIVERSITY.

SYDNEY, December 22.

The Senate of the Sydney University has had before it a proposal by Cardinal Moran for the establishment of a college for nuns. The main feature of which was to be practically the opening of a branch within the convent in the city, where inmates would receive instructions and pass for university degrees. After consideration extending over several months the proposal was rejected by the Senate by a small majority. It is stated that about the middle of the year a proposal was placed before Sir Norman MacLaurin (Chancellor of the University) that a hall be built in one of the convents in which nuns from the various establishments of the church could attend lectures given by their own lecturers, and from them receive certificates of attendance, to be presented as a necessary qualification for admission to the examinations for degrees. The matter was referred to a committee of Senate members, which, it is understood, favoured the college being established as an entirely separate branch of the university. The committee proposed that Cardinal Moran should undertake to guarantee for a fixed term of years a sufficient sum annually to cover all expenses connected with the appointment of lecturers, and should erect and equip suitable buildings, and pay the administrative cost and wages. These conditions are said to have been agreed to by Cardinal Moran, and an annual entry of about 80 ministers as students was anticipated, but the Senate, after giving much consideration to the report of the committee, decided that the proposals could not be accepted.
