BACHELOR OF MUSIC DEGREE.

A discussion took place at a meeting of the Senate of the University on Wednesday afternoon on the question of the Bachelor of Music degree. Professor Ennis moved to amend the regulations so as to give candidates the choice of presenting themselves after having passed the three years' course as executants instead of enforcing the composition of a musical exercise as has been the case in the past. He explained that the object was to give an alternative to candidates. It was not intended, however, to cheapen the degree, as each candidate who elected to present himself as an executant would be required to show special skill in the execution and interpretation of solo and ensemble works in different styles, also to show an intimate knowledge of classical and standard musical literature in connection with his special subject, extending over a wide scope. This would be quite as useful a test, as, and from the standpoint of the general public more useful than, the average musical composition worked out in connection with the examinations, 95 per cent. of which never saw the daylight after they had once been placed on the University shelves. Mr. T. H. Jones, Mus. Bac., seconded the motion, and contended that the innovation would ensure a high standard of practical work. Mr. W. M. Hole, Mus. Bac., protested strongly against the innovation, which he said would lessen the value of the degree. He argued that the proposal was a subterfuge, resorted to because at present a small proportion only of the candidates succeeded in taking the degree. It would make the standard lower than that of other universities. Mrs. Dodwell and Miss Cooke, Mus. Bac., opposed the motion. They each thought that a distinct value would attach to such a standard in execution as that suggested, but that some other diploma or recognition should be awarded, and not the Mus. Bac. degree in respect to it. The motion was carried. Mr. Hole called for a division, which resulted in 16 for the motion and 7 against it.
