Dear Huxley,

I am sorry you feel you have cause for irritation about the letter to Nature. I did not, however, as you say, tell you 'definitely that I was to await a proof from "NATURE" when corrections could be made'. I said that corrections could be made in the proof, hoping that you would send any in time for me to do so.

In view of my not putting Jacqueline into the count, I should be glad to be able to list further any relationships among the chimps at Regent's Park and Whipnade, and indeed whether they are related closely to those at Edinburgh. Does the Zoo keep records of such connections in any convenient form, and should I apply to Fisher for further details? At present the only relationships I have are those of Sally and her baby, and of Jacqueline and her two parents; but, as chimps have been successfully bred in recent years, I imagine that menagerie stock may be quite extensively related.
