Dear Huxley,

At the last B.A. meeting at Aberdeen the Committee without grant was appointed with Gross as secretary with a view to a selection experiment with Artemia , which I think he has already discussed with you.

Owing to the fact that simultaneously the Measurements Committee, of which you were Chairman, was revived your name seems to have got left out from Gross's Committee. I have, however, seen all the members now and we are unanimous in wanting to co-opt you, as was indeed our original intention.

I want to have a meeting sometime before Christmas for Gross to set out his plans in detail and exhibit his methods and material. I find I can get Grey and Russell at 12 noon on Monday, December 17th., the first morning of the S.E.B. meeting at the School of Hygiene.
