I enclose list of birds. The odd sign on the left marks those which have not the full 100 eggs measured. I should be glad if you will consult Nicholson, as I had hoped to get his advice before trying to assign abundance figures. His data are I suppose all from Britain, but should be invaluable in interpreting non quantitative estimates for other regions. I had thought after getting the breeding range mapped to compare statements if such exist of relative abundance for different parts of the range. Where Britain is an important part, however, I suppose Nicholson may have decisive evidence at once.
