There are two types of scholarships: Adelaide Summer Research Scholarships and the School of Animal and Veterinary Sciences Summer Research Scholarships. We strongly recommend that you apply for both.



- > Electricity, water and gas.

Students are responsible for:

- > Additional meals.
- > Telephone call costs.

- > Pastoral care provided by College staff and Senior Student Residents.
- > Coin operated launderette.
- > Gymnasium, Swimming Pool, Sports Courts
- > General Library and Computer Centre.
- > Student Study Spaces.

Fees can be paid in instalments over the full term of the accommodation agreement.

Bovine Special Interest Group “Moo Crew”

Rural Practice Day 2013

On Saturday August 31 the Moo Crew and ESIG held the 2013 Rural Practice Day. The day was attended by 39 students from 2nd year Vet BioScience to 3rd year DVM. The students were broken in to four groups to work through 5 stations covering Cattle, Sheep, Horses and the Role of a Government vet.



Dr Andrew Hoare from South East Vets and Dr Kiro Petrovski ran a station in the anatomy lab working with cattle legs, uteri and eyes. Students were taught how pair and shape hooves, perform intra-venous anaesthesia of the hoof and remove claws by Dr Andrew. Dr Andrew also demonstrated how to pass an Artificial insemination catheter through a cows cervix and how to ultrasound a cows reproductive tract. Dr Kiro demonstrated a wide range of eye blocks used in cattle when performed eye enucleation and third eyelid flaps.

Students then moved to the sheep research shed where they were taken through the process of laparoscopic insemination of ewes and process of collect ram semen. This session was taken by Dr Ken Watson from Bordertown. The students then moved to the shearing shed for a short take from Dr Jeremy Rogers from PIRSA who spoke the role of a government vet in South Australia and the Foot & Mouth Disease training program available in Nepal to Australian Vets wishing to gain further experience.

Teaching Cow Sessions

Moo Crew has been organising “Teaching Cow sessions” throughout the year. For those who don't know about the teaching cow, this cow is bought into the University's Production Animal Clinic for the second week of each Production Animal core rotation for the DVM 3 students to work with. On the Tuesday of this week Moo Crew members have been lucky enough to be able to attend lunch time sessions to improve their skills with the live cow. The sessions have included the basic clinical examination of the

Two stations were then held at the equine teaching barn. The first was taken by Dr Lucas van Oijen, who demonstrated to students how to perform equine limb bandages. Students were given advice on hock, hoof, carpus and fetlock bandages, each students was able to perform a number of bandages under Dr Lucas' supervision.

The final station for the day was a session with Dr Mary Carr from PIRSA Biosecurity. Dr Mary took students through the process of attending a suspected Hendra horse case. Students were able to put on the full Hendra Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and Dr Mary went through all the different samples which should be taken if Hendra is suspected.

The practical part of the day ended with drinks and nibbles on the grass outside the Vet Building. Several students and demonstrators then headed over the Roseworthy Hotel for dinner and drinks to end a long and exciting day.

Should you be registered with the Disability Service?

University study can be a challenge ... even more so if you have a disability or condition that you need to manage as well.

The Disability Service can help you manage ways to accommodate your disability whilst at Uni so you can focus your energies towards your studies. We not only look at physical or practical assistance, but we also look at ways to improve study habits in the University environment.

And we value your privacy. Our strong commitment to confidentiality supports all students that we assist.

What types of disabilities do we support?

Student disabilities can include a wide range of issues:

Learning disabilities (such as dyslexia, dyspraxia

or writing and reading difficulties)

Medical conditions (such as Crohns Disease, Chronic Fatigue Syndrome or other physical issues)

Mental illness (an anxiety disorder such as OCD or PTSD, depression, bipolar disorder or schizophrenia)

Sensory impairments (vision or hearing)

Mobility issues

Brain injury (such as strokes or injuries caused by accidents)

Disabilities and conditions do not have to be permanent. We assist students with temporary medical issues such as those caused by sporting accidents (a fractured limb).

How can the Disability Service assist you?

We can work out ways that you can fulfil the expectations of your studies whilst maintaining the required academic standards. Sometimes

people can feel overwhelmed about being faced with these expectations. Remember, it is not about avoiding these expectations, it is about working with them.

Some of the ways we can help

- ◆ Assistance and confidence to approach lecturers

Moving on... David Rutley



Student Experience on AHEMS

Jordan Meade

After completing my secondary studies in 2008 I travelled to Canada on a 4- month study exchange to experience first-hand the difference in production systems, showing technique and importantly, the beautiful scenery. I returned motivated and ready to begin my Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting) degree at Adelaide University in 2010. Whilst this brought me the success of employment as a full time junior accountant I felt over time that it wasn't what I was destined to do. My trip to Canada along with my intense passion for animals saw me apply for the Bachelor of Veterinary Bioscience at Adelaide University in 2012. Although initially unsuccessful I worked hard during that year to be eventually accepted to transfer into the Veterinary Science 2012 cohort.

I have loved every minute of the veterinary challenge so far and in particular the opportunity to gain experience from the real world via the AHEMS program. I have so far completed placements at an intensive piggery, a large sheep property and at the SA Junior Heifer Expo 2013. By far the most memorable for me would be the Heifer Expo where I was unexpectedly recognized as the Senior Champion Herdsman and was awarded the North America Study Scholarship. As part of the senior herdsman program we were judged on all as-

pects of our showing, preparing and attitude throughout the 4- day show. Assessments included a 3-paneled interview, a marketing assignment, junior judging, clipping, stall maintenance, the 'buddy' system and more. The culmination of many years of experience and hard work will see me travel to North America, where I will look to broaden my experience in cattle medicine, specifically related to nutrition and genetics.

The AHEMS program is an invaluable opportunity for veterinary students to develop the skills required to approach a variety of situations. Importantly for me, each placement motivated me further towards my ultimate goal of becoming a reliable, trustworthy and proficient production animal veterinarian.
