

MR. BICKERSTETH LEAVING

Will Return in October

Having been granted leave of absence by the school governors, Rev. K. J. F. Bickersteth (head master of St. Peter's College) announced this afternoon that he would leave at the end of April on a brief visit to Britain.



His intention is to be present at a family reunion at Canterbury, England, on the occasion of the golden wedding of his parents in June.

Mr. Bickersteth, who this afternoon informed scholars of his intention, said that he had not arrived at a decision until he had seen the work of the college well under way for the year and had been convinced that he could make the trip without prejudice to the school.

Mr. Frank A. Mr. Bickersteth anticipates being in Britain about three months. He will return to Adelaide in time to take up his duties again in October. He will go by way of Canada, and will come home by way of the Suez Canal. While abroad he hopes to visit a number of the leading schools and universities to study advance educational methods.
