It came as a shock to most people last week when it was announced that Mr. W. T. McCoy, the Director of Education, had died after a very brief illness. He was only sixty-two years old in his apparent prime, and with the knowledge and experience which would have served the State and its educational system for many years. It is surprising how many of our leading men, men of brilliance who have devoted their lives to their work, have passed away

around the age of 60. Ten years ago the Government of the day decided to obtain the best man available for the task of directing our educational sys-tem. Education, in this State, has always been on a high level, and the State has been fortunate in the men it has had at the head of its system. The late Director was brought to this State from Tasmania. The reputation he had there was soon confirmed and during the last ten years many splendid improvements have been made in the edu-cational system. The training of the teachers has been put on a sound basis, whilst various branches of practical secondary schools have been established. Many reforms have been introduced, and South Australia can be well proud of the provision

Australia can be well proud of the provision made for the education of its school pupils. The late Mr. McCoy set himself to his task with a purpose. He knew what he wanted, and unnecessary delays in attaining his object irked him. He was popular with the teachers under him, and the State has lost a most valuable servant, and one whom it is going to be exceedingly difficult to re-
