

You may have heard about the University's recently released \$14.3M <u>Campus Sustainability Plan</u>. For our Campus, this means the University is investing a large portion of this money into a Solar Farm here at Roseworthy, which will provide upwards of 1.1MW of power and cover an area of 10,000sqm. The School of Engineering will be assisting in designing the Solar Farm and, together with implementation of energy efficient lighting and other carbon reduction plans, we look forward to the Campus moving towards a more environmentally sustaining position in the near future.





It's so easy to get drawn into the stress of exams but remember, this is your chance to demonstrate everything you've learnt this semester. Take it as an opportunity to prove just how awesome you are!

# Develop a positive mind set.

- Believe in yourself know your own potential go for it!
- No comparisons don't compare yourself to others. Focus on you and your exams. It's your future and that's all that matters. Do your very best!
- Squash the negativity don't let negative thoughts invade your headspace. Just because you have the thought doesn't mean that it is true or that you have to believe it. Positive self talk is the key.

You are strongly advised not to bring a bag and/or personal items to the exam venue. Only bring to an exam those items which you need to undertake the exam.

Place all the materials you will need on your desk and put any other materials eg. mobile phones and pencil cases in your closed bag under your seat.

# MUST BRING to each exam:

- Your student ID (or other photo identification)
- Reasonable supplies of all required writing materials, erasers, etc.

#### **Materials permitted:**

- A small purse or wallet, including keys, money, ID & credit cards
- One clear bottle of clear water, up to 1 litre in size (water is available at the venue)
- A closed bag stored under your seat
- Any materials specified by the examiner, as set out on the front page of the exam paper

# **Materials Not permitted:**

You must not bring into the exam venue any material which enables, or has the potential to enable, you or others to cheat or to gain an unfair academic advantage. Examples of materials which are not permitted include, but are not limited to:

- writing or other paper
- dictionaries, textbooks, notes or other reference material not specified on the front page of the exam paper
- electronic devices including: diaries, dictionaries, organisers, laptop or palmtop computers unless specified by the examiner
- any drinks other than clear water in a clear container.

# **Bags**

Students bringing **bags** into the exam venue may be subject to inspection as you enter the venue. Place all the materials you will need on your desk, close your bag and store it under your seat. Any items not permitted in the exam must be stored in your bag and not your pockets.

# Materials NOT to be removed:

You must not remove any materials issued for use in the exam. All such materials remain the property of the University, whether they were used or not. These include completed scripts, ripped out pages, blank answer books, question papers, drawing paper and scribble paper.

#### **Mobile Phones**

You are not permitted to bring your mobile phone into the exam venue unless it is switched off and stored in your closed bag under your seat.

If a mobile phone is found switched on in your possession during the exam it will be deemed as a breach of the policy and will be held as unauthorised material and returned to you at the end of the exam. This may result in the matter being referred to the Head of School for further action in accordance with the Academic Dishonesty Procedures.

Students who become ill on the way to or during the exam must notify an exam supervisor at the venue and apply for a replacement exam **within 3 business days** of the date of the primary exam.



**Application Deadline**—Last day to check for an automatic application or to apply using Access Adelaide is 11:59pm Sunday, 3 December 2017.

**Graduation Status Letter Date**—View your Graduation Status Letter in Access Adelaide Friday 15, December 2017.

**BPAY, PostBillPay or ePayment Deadline—Last** day to use BPAY, PostBillPay or ePayment to resolve any outstanding debts that are preventing you from conferral is Sunday 17, December 2017.

**Anomalies Deadline** - 5:00pm on Thursday 21, December 2017—Last day to:

- -Resolve any issue preventing you from conferral
- -Change any name details or award details

**Conferral line placed on transcript**—by 5:00pm on Monday, 8 January 2018

# What's the difference between Completion & Conferral?

- Completion: Completion is an automatic system process that will be added to your academic transcript once it has been verified by your Faculty that your completed courses meet the academic program rules of your degree. Please refer to the <u>important deadlines page on</u> <u>the graduations website</u>.
- Conferral: Conferral means that you have completed all requirements for your award and are eligible to become a legal graduate of the University. Once you have been conferred into your award you are a legal graduate of the University and can use any titles associated with your award.



# Testamurs, Transcripts & AHEGS

You can now purchase official academic transcripts, pay for testamur postage, apply for a replacement or re-issue testamur, and purchase copies of your AHEGS, through the online shop.

#### Do you need an Official Academic Transcript?

Transcripts can be purchased through the Online Shop on Unified. Unofficial Academic Transcripts can be downloaded from your Access Adelaide account.

Current students are now able to purchase printed Official Academic Transcripts and/or digital Official Academic Transcripts. Graduating students from July 2017 Conferrals will be issued a complimentary digital transcript shortly after conferral.

Students who intend to graduate as part of the next available ceremonies need to ensure there is a completion row on their official academic transcript before ordering.

Online Shop

#### My eQuals

My eQuals is an online system used to issue digital transcripts and graduation documents. Eligible students and graduates can securely access their digital documents, and share them with employers, universities, and other parties.

#### **Testamur**

A testamur is the legal document you receive after graduation. Also known as a 'Degree certificate' or 'parchment', Testamurs are the legal certification that your degree has been conferred. A testamur contains your name, the degree you completed, and the date it was conferred. Testamurs are signed by the Chancellor as well as the Vice-Chancellor and President of the University.

# Australian Higher Education Graduation Statement (AHEGS)

The AHEGS is received as an addition to other graduation documentation, such as testamurs and academic transcripts.



# Africa Trip

This year, three groups of students went to South Africa for either an elective or for EMS. The host organisation that kindly runs this trip is WildlifeVets South Africa, and has been running since 2013. The trip was wildlife medicine focused, but also involved community work with rabies prevention, preventative health work with local cattle farmers, pathology, anaesthetic drug trials, pharmacology lectures, darting, and plenty of hands-on work. During our downtime, we also had in-depth discussions about the current issues threatening conservation in South Africa. 


