1 INFORMATION PROVIDED IN THE REPORT

The Demonstration Sites for Day Respite in Residential Care Facilities Initiative (DDR) Services Activities Report (SAR) is required to be completed by all NRCP funded respite services. Reports must be lodged:

- by 31 January, for the 6 month reporting period 1 July to 31 December; and
- by 31 July for the 12 month reporting period 1 July to 30 June.

This report overviews the information provided in the SARs presented to the Department of Health and Ageing by DDR projects. At the same time, it assesses the usefulness of the SAR and its associated components as a data collection tool, and suggests improvements for future collections. The report draws on 2007/08 and 2008/09 data provided by the Department to the AISR for analysis.

Section 2 provides a summary of carer and care recipient profiles, based on the analysis of SAR data provided to the AISR.

Section 3 reviews the data collection instrument currently being used.

Section 4 presents a validation of data keyed from the SAR, identifying any inconsistencies. This is based on 2007/08 and 2008/09 SAR data keyed into Excel spreadsheets by the Department and provided to the AISR for analysis.

Section 5 presents the results of the AISR's analysis of the Excel based data. This includes a summary of client, carer and care recipient profiles, providing examples of the type of information that can be drawn from the SAR collection.

Section 6 provides an overview of design difficulties identified by the AISR and a summary of recommendations about future SAR data collection and re-design, arising from our analysis.

The **Appendix** section provides a summary of statistical data obtained from the SAR analysis. Appendix I presents the DDR funded projects providing SAR data. Appendix II provides summary information about carer and care recipients for the years 2007/08 and 2008/09, while Appendix III plots carer and care recipient cultural profile information on a project by project basis.

2 SUMMARY OF KEY FINDINGS

2.1 PROFILE OF PROJECTS BY LOCATION

SAR data were provided for only **25** out of a possible **29** Projects in **2007/08**. These were located in seven States/Territories, with the highest reported number of projects being located in Victoria (6 or 24%) while the smallest number of projects (4.0%) were in the Northern Territory.

In **2008/09**, SAR data were available for **29** out of a possible **30** Projects, again from seven Australian States/Territories. The highest number of projects were located in New South Wales (7 or 24.1%) while the smallest number were in Tasmania with nearly 7 per cent of projects.

2.2 CARER PROFILE

Carer numbers doubled between 2007/08 and 2008/09, with SAR data from -

- > 25 NRCP projects identifying **605** carers in **2007/08**, and data from
- > 29 NRCP projects identifying **1277** carers in **2008/09**.

Table 1 compares carer profiles in 2007/08 and 2008/09. It can be seen that the proportion of carers from Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) backgrounds nearly trebled, those from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) backgrounds remained almost unchanged at approximately one in five carers, and those in rural or remote locations increased as did those from financially or socially disadvantaged backgrounds. Employed carers rose slightly while the proportion of new carers had reduced.

It can be seen from *Table 2* that by the second year of study, **450** carers had exited the service compared with **11** in the first year. Waiting lists had reduced from **108** during 2007/08 to **27** in 2008/09. This reflects the fact the first year was a six month period whereas the second involved a full twelve months.

2.3 CARE RECIPIENT PROFILE

As discussed in Section 4, the AISR analysis of SAR data has identified a number of discrepancies in information that question the reliability of the information collected. These discrepancies apply to care recipient numbers.

In 2007/08, across 25 NCRP projects supplying SAR data, the total number of care recipients reported at Part B1 was 713 persons and the total number of hours delivered was 40,074 hours.

However, data from Part D of the SAR reported **534 care recipients over 65 years of age** and **51 care recipients under the age of 65**. This gives a total of **585 care recipients**.

This understates the total number of care recipients reported at B.1 by 128 care recipients

- The average number of care recipients per project was 28.5 (ranging from a minimum of 4 to a maximum of 129).
- The average number of hours delivered per project was **1,603.0** hours per project (ranging from a minimum of 108 hours to a maximum of 5,262 hours).
- The median number of care recipients per project was 18.0 and
- The median number of hours delivered was 951 hours.

In **2008/09**, across 29 NCRP projects supplying SAR data, the total number of **care recipients** was **1,288 persons** and the total number of **hours delivered** was **246,836 hours**.

Data from Part D of the SAR reported **1,018 care recipients over 65 years of age** and **60 care recipients under the age of 65**. This gives a total of **1,078 care recipients**.

This understates the total number of care recipients reported at B.1 by 210 care recipients

- The average number of care recipients per project was **44.4** (ranging from a minimum of 15 to a maximum of 131).
- The **average number of hours** delivered per project was **8,511.6 hours per project** (ranging from a minimum of 1,080 hours to a maximum of 36,510 hours).
- > The median number of care recipients per project was 37.0 and
- The median number of hours delivered was 6,401.0 hours.

2.4 OVERALL TREND FROM 2007/08 TO 2008/09

Reflecting the growth in the program and the fact that most projects were operational for half of the 2007/08 financial year compared with the full year of operation characterising 2008/09, the following increases were evident in relation to -

- a) average number of care recipients,
- b) average number of hours delivered by each project,
- c) median number of care recipients per project, and
- d) median number of hours delivered.



3 THE SAR DATA COLLECTION INSTRUMENT

The SAR data collection instrument is distributed to service providers as an 11 page Word document. An accompanying 9 page "Directions and Definitions" Word document is also provided to service providers. These forms have been the same for all 2007/08 and 2008/09 data collections. The main components of SAR data collection instrument are summarised in *Table 3*.

It must be noted that the table at Part B.1 Achievements includes rows to report on services not within scope of the Day Respite in Residential Aged Care Facilities (RACF) Initiative. For example, "Daytime Respite – In-home", "Overnight Respite – In-home", Community Access – Individual", "Host Family – Overnight", etc.

The AISR has been assured by the data collection agency that data provided for this analysis does not include information relating to services outside the scope of the Day Respite in RACF) Initiative.

3.1 DATA INCLUDED AND EXCLUDED FOR ANALYSIS

Excel spreadsheets containing 2007/08 and 2008/09 SAR data were supplied by the Department to the AISR for analysis.

For both reporting years, not all quantitative data items reported on the SAR have been keyed into the Excel spreadsheets.

With regard to the 2008/09 data, items keyed into the Excel spreadsheet are presented in *Table 4*. This table makes reference to the corresponding section of the SAR data collection instrument from which the data was collected. Other quantitative data items collected on the SAR instrument - but not keyed into Excel for analysis - are shown in *Table 5*.

4 DATA VALIDATION AND INCONSISTENCIES

The AISR analysis of SAR data has identified a number of discrepancies in information that question the reliability of the information collected in relation to recipient numbers.

4.1 TOTAL NUMBER OF CARE RECIPIENTS

SAR Part D reports on numbers and characteristics of NCRP care recipients over 65 and under 65. The note after the table says that the sum of these figures should equal the figure entered at the bottom of Part B.1: "total no. of care recipients". Some Projects have reported numbers of care recipients with certain characteristics but this number is greater than the total number of care recipients. See Appendix III for details.

A validation analysis of these data items for both 2007/08 and 2008/09 SARS data has identified discrepancies in both years' data.

In 2007/08, the total number of care recipients reported at Part D who were over 65 and under 65 years of age did **not** equal the total number of care recipients reported at Part B.1 in relation to 10 projects. Project details and validation data for 2007/08 are presented in Table 6.

The ten Projects that reported validation errors in 2007/08 were not all the same ten Projects that reported errors in 2008/09. Six Projects reported validation errors both years.

These reporting errors may reflect a misunderstanding of data requirements and/or the need for simplified data collection tables.

5 FINDINGS EMERGING FROM THE DATA ANALYSIS

This section presents information about service provision by location, and carer and care recipient profile information for 2007/08 and 2008/09. Appendix II provides further detail while Appendix I lists the Projects supplying this information through the SAR.

5.1 SERVICE PROVIDER BY LOCATION PROFILE


5.1.1 2007/08 PROFILE

The 2007/08 SAR Excel spreadsheet reported on 29 Projects, however, data was provided for only **25 Projects,** from seven Australian states/territories. The four projects not supplying data were:

- NSW 2943
- SA 1306
- NT 238
- NT 239.

In 2007/08, the highest reported number of projects were located in Victoria with 6 (24%) of the 25 projects while the smallest number of projects (4.0%) were in the Northern Territory. Refer to *Figure* 1 for other State/Territory based locations.





5.1.2 2008/09 PROFILE

The 2008/09 SAR Excel spreadsheet provided data on **30 Projects**, from seven Australian States/Territories. Only one Project did not supply any data. This was VIC 3839.




Figure 2: 2007/08 DDR Projects with Data by State/Territory

The State/Territory with the highest number of projects was New South Wales with 7 (24.1%) of the 29 projects while the smallest number were in Tasmania with nearly 7 per cent of projects. Refer to *Figure 2* for other States/Territories' share of projects.

5.2 CARER PROFILE

5.2.1 CARER PROFILE IN 2007/08

2007/08 SAR data from 25 NRCP projects reported that **605 carers** were assisted in the 12 month period **1 July 2007 to 30 June 2008**. The numbers and characteristics of these carers are presented in *Table 8*. It can be seen that 91.1% are new carers receiving support and that a substantial proportion are drawn from groups with special needs. This involves –

- o 19.5% from a CALD background
- 1.3% from an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander background

- o 14.6% from a rural or remote location
- o 17.0% who are financially or social disadvantaged
- o 26.8% who are employed.

5.2.2 EXITS

SAR data (Part E) reported that **11** carers left the service during 2007/08. These **11** carers were from three individual projects.

5.2.3 WAITING LISTS

SAR data (Part K) also reported **108** primary carers on the waiting list as at 30 June 2008. These were reported across 17 projects with the highest number of carers on the waiting list being 22 (QLD 1231) and 19 (TAS 369). Eight projects reported no clients on waiting lists.

5.2.4 CARER PROFILE IN 2008/09

2008/09 SAR data from 29 NRCP projects reported that **1277 carers** were assisted in the 12 month period **1 July 2008 to 30 June 2009**. The numbers and characteristics of these carers are presented in *Table 9*.

It can be seen that the proportion who are new carers receiving support has declined from over 90 per cent in the preceding year to 54.6%, and that a substantial proportion continued to be drawn from groups with special needs – with increases in most of these groups from 2007/08-2008/09. Specifically –

- o 20.3% were from a CALD background
- o 3.4% were from an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander background
- o 22.5% were from a rural or remote location
- o 24.4% were financially or social disadvantaged
- o 31.4% were employed.

5.2.5 EXITS

SAR data (Part E) reported that **450** carers left the service during **2008/09**. All 29 Projects reported some level of carers exiting the service.

5.2.6 WAITING LISTS

SAR data (Part K) reported a total of **27** primary carers on the waiting list as at **30 June 2008.** However, these were reported across only 5 projects with the highest number of carers on a waiting list being **17** (VIC 3838). Eighteen projects reported no clients on waiting lists (with the remaining seven Projects not reporting data for this field).

5.3 CARE RECIPIENT PROFILE

Due to inconsistencies between the number of care recipients reported at SAR Part B.1 and in SAR Part D (see description of variation in Section 0 of this report), the care recipient profile has been analysed separately using SAR Part B.1 data and SAR Part D data.

5.3.1 SAR PART D - CARE RECIPIENTS IN 2007/08

The number and characteristics of care providers was also reported at Part D of the SAR. Data from this section reported **534 care recipients over 65 years of age** and **51 care recipients under the age of 65**. This gives a total of **585 care recipients**.

This understates the total number of care recipients reported at B.1 by <u>128</u> care recipients (refer Table 6 for breakdown by project).

Characteristics of the **585** care recipients reported at Part D are shown in *Table 10*.

5.3.2 SAR PART D - CARE RECIPIENTS IN 2008/09

The number and characteristics of care providers was also reported at Part D of the SAR. Data from Part D of the SAR reported **1,018 care recipients over 65 years of age** and **60 care recipients under the age of 65**. This gives a total of **1,078 care recipients**.

This understates the total number of care recipients reported at B.1 by 210 care recipients.

Characteristics of the 1,078 care recipients reported at Part D are shown in Table 11.

5.4 CARER AND CARE RECIPIENT CULTURAL PROFILES

It would be expected that most carers and care recipients have a shared cultural background but this was not evident in the SAR reports.

In 2007/08 -

- Eight carers (1.3%) and only one care recipient (0.2%) were reported as being from an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander background.
- Nearly one in five carers (19.5%) were from a CALD background compared to one in ten care recipients (10.4%) being from a CALD background.

In **2008/09** there was less difference, for all Projects, with 4.0% of care recipients and 3.4% of carers being reported as being from an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander background.

However, slightly more than one in five carers (20.3%*) were reported as being from a CALD background compared to 14.6%* of care recipients.

Perhaps of greater benefit is to compare carer and care recipient cultural profiles on a Project basis (rather than for all projects as a whole). This analysis will also assist with identifying those Projects with a greater emphasis on the provision of care for those with special needs.

The AISR has undertaken a **preliminary** cultural profile for carers and care recipients on a Project basis to illustrate this. That analysis is provided in **Appendix III.**

Please note that data validation errors will need to be rectified before this data can be used for all Projects.

* Important note: Data from the analysis at Appendix III has identified data errors that make the total proportion of carers and care recipients for all Projects unreliable.

5.5 CARE RECIPIENTS AND HOURS DELIVERED

5.5.1 CARE RECIPIENTS AND HOURS DELIVERED - SAR PART B.1, 2007-2008

In 2007/08, Part B.1 of the SAR data reported that, across 25 NCRP projects, the total number of **care recipients** was **713 persons** and the total number of **hours delivered** was **40,074 hours**.




Figure 3: 2007/2008 Numbers of Care Recipients and Hours Delivered

The distribution of numbers of care recipients and hours of service delivered for all 25 projects is shown in *Figure 3*.

- The average number of care recipients per project was 28.5 (ranging from a minimum of 4 to a maximum of 129).
- The average number of hours delivered per project was 1,603.0 hours per project (ranging from a minimum of 108 hours to a maximum of 5,262 hours).
- > The median number of care recipients per project was 18.0 and
- > The median number of hours delivered was 951 hours.

5.5.2 CARE RECIPIENTS AND HOURS DELIVERED - SAR PART B.1, 2008-2009

In 2008/09, Part B.1 of the SAR data reported that, across 29 NCRP projects, the total number of **care recipients** was **1,288 persons** and the total number of **hours delivered** was **246,836 hours**.




Figure 4: 2008/2009 Numbers of Care Recipients and Hours Delivered

The distribution of numbers of care recipients and hours of service delivered for all 29 projects is shown in *Figure 4*.

- The average number of care recipients per project was 44.4 (ranging from a minimum of 15 to a maximum of 131).
- The average number of hours delivered per project was **8,511.6** hours per project (ranging from a minimum of 1,080 hours to a maximum of 36,510 hours).
- > The median number of care recipients per project was 37.0 and
- > The median number of hours delivered was 6,401.0 hours.

6 RECOMMENDED CHANGES TO THE SAR DATA COLLECTION

6.1 CHANGES TO THE MAIN DATA COLLECTION TOOL

As a general rule, table headings could be clearer and have less wordy descriptions. With regard to the table in **Part B.1**, the headings are quite detailed and it is not easy to identify what information is required. Also, the descriptive request for total information (entitled "Total Number of Individual Carers and Care Requirements") is very difficult to comprehend. This information could be better collected in the same table.

Refer to CHART 1 for a suggested alternative for Part B.1.

The two tables at **Part D** are unnecessarily repetitive. The tables could be combined and set out as in CHART 2.

(Please note that suggested changes provided in CHARTS 1 and 2 are *indicative* of the suggested revised format of basic content only. Tables will require further review to ensure all relevant footnotes, descriptions, etc are included as necessary.)

For **Part L** "Average number of complaints received in the last six (or twelve) months", there is no need for this to state "average" as a particular number in a particular period is being sought - i.e. it is not asking for average number of complaints per week.

6.2 CHANGES TO THE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

The "Directions and Definitions" Word document that supports the data collection instrument appears useful and is adequately presented. However, some minor directions, for *Parts I and J* for example, could be readily incorporated into the data collection instrument.

Consideration could be given to the amalgamation of these documents – so that the definitions are provided at the end of the data collection form and the directions are included within the data collection form. However, this should be considered in consultation with service providers to see what they find most useful.

6.3 SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED CHANGES TO DATA COLLECTION DESIGN

Recommendation 1: That Parts B.1 and D of the data collection instrument be further simplified.

Recommendation 2: That investigation be undertaken into the differences between the total number of care

recipients reported at Part B.1 and Part D (sum over 65 and under 65) and in relation to

carer and care recipient cultural characteristics (CALD and ATSI background).

Recommendation 3: That the question at Part L "On average, how many complaints did you receive in the last

six (or twelve) months?" be reworded to ask "Approximately how many complaints did you receive in the last six (or twelve) months?" Or to seek the specific number of complaints –

"How many complaints did you receive in the last six (or twelve) months?"

Recommendation 4: That data validation checks are undertaken on data reported in SAR before they are

accepted by the Department.

Recommendation 5: That consideration be given to the amalgamation of the "Directions and Definitions" within

the SAR data collection instrument document – so that the definitions are provided at the end of the data collection form and the directions are included within the data collection form. This change should be made in consultation with service providers to see what they

find most useful.
