UNIVERSITY SHAKESPEARE SOCIETY.

As might have been expected the heat was severely felt in the University Library on Thursday night. It was the occasion of the final meeting of the fourteenth session of the University Shakespeare Society, and the ill-ventilated hall was filled with members and their friends. Yet, in spite of the almost suffocating state of the atmosphere, the entertainment was thoroughly enjoyed by those present. Miss Campbell (Mus. Bac.) opened the programme with a pianoforte selection—Chopin's Nocturne No. 11—for which she was heartily applauded. Then Mr. H. T. Prince gave an acceptable rendering of "Plymouth Sound," and Miss Corvan, the Elder scholar, who received a flattering reception, exhibited with marked success her powers as a pianoforte player. Miss Ethel Hack appeared to advantage in "The willow song," her rendition of which was much appreciated. Then followed dramatic scenes from the third act of "Romeo and Juliet," the characters being creditably sustained by Messrs. A. White and R. C. Pitcher, as Romeo and Friar Lawrence, and Miss Kelly and Mrs. Ive as Juliet and the nurse. Mr. R. Troughton sang "Montrose's love song," and then Miss Ethel Hack again favored the audience, her selection being "The song of the river," which received tasteful treatment and evoked well deserved recognition. "The skippers of St. Ives," a song well suited to his voice, was contributed by Mr. H. T. Prince, after which came several scenes from the third and fourth acts of "Hamlet," Mr. R. C. Pitcher impersonating the prince; Miss Howe, Ophelia; Mr. H. Barrett, Claudius, King of Denmark; Mr. A. White, Laertes; Mr. H. L. Kekwick, Horatio; and Mrs. Ive, Gertrude, Queen of Denmark. Miss Hilfers gave a selection on the pianoforte, and Mr. R. Troughton "The song of Hybrias the Cretan." The entertainment was under the immediate supervision of Mr. E. H. Lock, the secretary of the society, and it passed off most successfully.
