ADELAIDE UNIVERSITY.
 The Adelaide University Senate recent-
 ly passed new regulations for the affiliation
 of Roseworthy Agricultural College with
 the University; repealed the regulations re-
 lating to the degree of doctor of laws, and
 substituted others therefor; revised the re-
 gulations dealing with the degree of B.Sc.;
 altered the period of practical experience
 for candidates for the University diploma
 in applied science and the fellowship of
 the South Australian School of Mines and
 Industries from six to 12 months; and
 made alterations in respect to the junior
 and senior public and the junior commercial
 examinations. The Executive Council on
 Thursday approved of the new regulations
 and alterations. A special meeting
 of the senate of the University
 will be held on Wednesday, De-
 cember 13. The business will include an
 election to fill a vacancy on the council.
 There are three candidates for the posi-
 tion—Messrs. W. J. Isbister, LL.B., S.
 Smeaton, B.A., and F. W. Young, LL.B.

ANNUAL SCHOLASTIC EXAMINA-
 TIONS.
 The school year comes to an end shortly,
 and already students are counting up the
 weeks, and in some cases, days, which will
 intervene before the holidays begin. The
 secondary educational institutions of the
 State have, roughly speaking, 40 weeks of
 work, divided for the most part into three
 terms, and 12 weeks of vacation. They stand
 midway between the University and the pri-
 mary schools in this respect as in others.
 The University labors for some weeks fewer,
 and the State schools are open for
 some weeks longer. The degree ex-
 aminations at the University began
 about three weeks ago and are
 now finished, and in the majority
 of cases the results have been published.
 The medical students, especially, have been
 very successful this year, and out of the
 nine who were in their fifth and final year,
 eight have passed the ordeal and are now
 fully-fledged bachelors of medicine. The
 students of the School of Mines and Indus-
 tries are at present undergoing their annual
 test of ability and skill, and the most nume-
 rously-attended examinations, those which
 affect the scholars of the State schools and
 the colleges, are now either over or in full
 swing. The "primary," in which over 900
 girls and boys participated, has terminated.
 Over 600 entered for the "junior," which be-
 gan on November 14 and ended on Wed-
 nesday last. There are over 400 taking
 part in the "senior," which began on
 Thursday, and will conclude on December 1.
 The "higher public" examination, in which
 there were over 170 participating, began
 on November 14 and terminated on Thurs-
 day. The school and college speech days
 are usually held about the middle of Decem-
 ber.
