

sent our congratulatory address, and Professor Henderson (who is one of your own graduates) have consented to represent us. The foundation of your university must always be regarded as the most important academical event in Australian history. Under the leadership of Wentworth, your great founder, during the infancy of representative government in Australia, New South Wales led the way in the establishment of the University of Sydney, the first in the southern world to receive the authentication of a Royal charter for its degrees. The privileges you secured were won, not for yourselves alone, but also for the other Australian universities which have since been founded, largely under the inspiration of your example. Moreover you have set an excellent pattern, which the other Australian universities have not failed to copy, in maintaining a high standard of learning in your schools. In Adelaide we are still further your debtors, as two of our professors and two of our lecturers also were trained in your classrooms. Quite recently we were further indebted to your courtesy and assistance in receiving 19 of our medical students, and enabling them to complete their curriculum for a degree when, owing to untoward circumstances altogether beyond our control, we had to send them elsewhere for the completion of their undergraduate course. To me it appears to be one of the happiest features of this jubilee that your illustrious predecessor, the first Chancellor, who delivered one of the inaugural addresses at the opening of your university 50 years ago, and who was mainly instrumental in obtaining your charter, still survives in an honored and happy old age. If he cannot witness, he will, though on the other side of the world, participate in your rejoicings. May I venture to add that, like my venerable friend, I also from a distance shall watch with the keenest interest all the glad incidents of the jubilee. Congratulating you, Sir Normand, on the distinction of being Chancellor at such a time, I wish for you a long and distinguished tenure of your high office, and for the great university over which you preside every increasing usefulness and success."
