ELDER CONSERVATORIUM.

The second chamber-music concert of the present session by the staff of the Elder Conservatorium attracted a large audience to the Elder Hall on Monday evening. The instrumental programme consisted entirely of novelties as far as this city is concerned—Schubert's duo in A for pianoforte and violin, Beethoven's sonata in F for pianoforte and 'cello, and Volkmann's trio in B flat minor for pianoforte, violin, and 'cello. Some additional interest was lent to the concert by the fact that Mr. G. Reimann made his reappearance at the pianoforte after a considerable period of retirement from public work. The most successful effort of the evening was the trio, written by Friedrich Robert Volkmann, one of the most eminent of modern composers, who was born in Saxony in 1815, and died nearly 19 years ago at Pesti. This trio, though new to Adelaide, is one of his most popular pieces. Written entirely upon modern lines, it contains many passages of singular power and beauty, and the resources of the instruments engaged are utilized to great advantage. An excellent rendering, that afforded ample evidence of careful and thorough preparation, was given by Messrs. Reimann, Heinicke, and Kugelberg, who were warmly applauded. Messrs. Reimann and Kugelberg played Beethoven's pianoforte and 'cello sonata in F, op. 5, No. 1, with considerable skill and taste, and a unity of purpose that calls for special mention. The balance of power between the two instruments was well maintained, and the final allegro vivace, taken at an exhilarating speed, excited hearty rounds of applause. Schubert's melodious duo for pianoforte and violin, in four movements—allegro moderato, scherzo, andantino, and allegro vivace—proved a most attractive composition, containing several unusual effects, such, for instance, as the queerly abrupt ending of the second movement. The andantino is quite a little gem, abounding in the richest Schubertian melody, and this section in particular was treated with great taste and artistic finish by the performers, Messrs. Reimann and Heinicke. In the other sections an earnest musician's reading was given, and the whole work proved thoroughly enjoyable. Vocal relief was afforded by Miss Gull Hack, A.R.C.M., who presented a novel little song by Arthur Bruhas, entitled The Solitary, with much taste and refinement. Miss Hack also scored a success in an admirably contrasted bracket of Grieg's The Swan and Good Morning. The spontaneous gaiety of the latter was so admirably expressed that an encore had to be granted, and another short selection was added. Mr. Reimann played the pianoforte accompaniments.

THE EXAMINER'S IMPRESSIONS.

Professor Ennis, Mus. Doc., the sole examiner, speaking of this, his first experience of South Australian elementary musical students, said to a representative of The Register:—"Most of the practical candidates I have examined have, of course, been unskilled in an elementary sense. While

the general standard exhibited by these young people was not, perhaps, particularly high, I may fairly say that the majority of them gave evidences of the most careful and painstaking preparation. Indeed, in some instances it was evident that the utmost care had been taken by teachers to adequately equip their students for the test. I found some distinctly gifted young players, who, I should say, were only in their early teens, and who had evidently worked hard. These should make really excellent pianists after a few more years' study. Naturally, the general average was slightly higher in the city than in the country districts, but there were some country candidates who were really excellent. The chief faults were in respect to touch and phrasing. Not many of the students displayed sufficient variety of tonepower, and in a number of instances the phrase marks were not attended to as they should have been. I did not meet many cases in which wrong notes had been learnt, but often the rests were not faithfully observed. There were occasional evidences of that common fault—the left hand coming before the right. Some of the candidates played their scales and arpeggios badly, but on the other hand there were others who quite surprised me by their readiness and accuracy. I do not think it is too much to expect a fairly artistic performance from a child of, say, Clementi's first Sonata, for it forms such an admirable preparation for the future. There is no doubt that with young beginners all the practising should be supervised, if possible, otherwise bad faults are quickly cultivated. Much quicker progress is made in this manner, and the more lessons per week that the child has the better." A few candidates presented themselves in violin playing, and the professor stated that they reached a fairly good standard. There were no vocal candidates.
