THE CHIEF JUSTICE AND PROFESSOR IVES.

To the Editor.

Sir—The Chief Justice's second letter is ingenious in its construction, if not convincing in its arguments. It seeks to divert attention from the real point at issue by raising those quibbles that a legal mind of long experience and practice knows well how to raise. No answer is given to my questions:—1. Why the original pass list was not posted when I handed it in? 2. How the chancellor knew of its existence before it was made public? 3. Why it was subsequently altered without a fresh, clean copy being written? I am content to leave fairminded people to form their own conclusions as to who is telling the truth.

One of the quibbles raised is that I was not an examiner on the occasion referred to. Clause 6, chapter II, of the university statutes reads:—"The council shall, when necessary, appoint a sufficient number of examiners, who, together with the professor and lecturers of the school of music, shall constitute the board of examiners in music." His Honor is surely playing upon words when he speaks of the pass list reproduced as a "report of the board of musical studies." All music examination pass lists are, as a matter of form, sent to the board of musical studies, and then on to the council for approval. If, as the chancellor says, he only sought an interview with me on the occasion when his relative was interested in order to see that a right construction was put upon the regulations, is it not rather singular that he had not done so on the previous occasions when others were classified? The statement that he never asked me to place his niece's name in the first class does not read well in face of this extract from a report of the chancellor's remarks at the university commemoration a few days afterwards:—"Florence Way Campbell, Mus. Bac. On Miss Campbell being presented the chancellor addressed her thus:—Perhaps I may be allowed, Miss Campbell, to express a little of avuncular as well of chancelloric pride that you have maintained the honour of your family as well as yourself in having passed each successive year of your undergraduate course in the first class, and that you are the first woman in Australia who has taken the degree of bachelor of music."

I only referred to Dr. Bridge, my co-examiner, because I was alluding to the contents of a letter he wrote. There was no reference to Sir Herbert Oakley in my remarks, and therefore no necessity to mention his name. The chancellor's letter claiming that he has shown that "Professor Ives's claim to have been one of the examiners is without foundation," seems rather curious after reading clause 6, chapter II, of the university statutes already quoted; indeed, this clause, which must have been known to the chancellor, disposes of all his subtle pleadings. Thus far the controversy as relating to this particular incident must be taken as closed.

Now to the general questions involved, I must repeat with all earnestness the closing sentence of my remarks at the university last Wednesday—"I demand that in the best interests of this young university the fullest enquiries should be made into its inner workings. Will the chancellor, the vice-chancellor, and the university council assist in bringing this about? Surely so if they have nothing to hide." There are already signs that effort of a strenuous character will be made to postpone this desirable end. Parliament has prorogued, the holidays are near, the council of the university is not to meet again this year, and so it is hoped the matter will be allowed to drift into oblivion. Such an enquiry may be big with the possibilities of unpleasant revelations, but surely, sir, if abuses have crept into the university, it is not wise to allow them to fructify and bring forth greater abundance of their kind. The span of human life is but short. In a comparatively little while I and you, sir, and those who are our companions in work will have passed away, and our places will be filled by a new generation. But kingdoms and institutions live on, and because the University of Adelaide will exist after we have played our part and left the stage I demand that its great possibilities of usefulness in building up the intellectual and moral characters of our children and their children shall not be imperilled. The numerous generous bequests that have led to the founding of the university have,

I believe, been made in that nobility of spirit which prompts men to do things for the betterment of their fellowmen. Because I believe this to be the foundation stone of the Adelaide University I demand that the institution shall be freed from abuses. It must not be allowed to become a place where its honours may be won more easily if one happens to be in favour with its officials. Its courts and classes and prizes must be open to all, irrespective of class or clique. Better an unpleasant enquiry now than that gross abuses shall be continued. The assumption of and wrong use of autocratic power are apt to become more and more dangerous if not checked.
