ANGLO-COLONIAL LETTER.

(From our Special Correspondent.)

The authorities of the Elder Conservatorium have applied to the Agent-General to find them a teacher of the pianoforte who will be willing to accept £500 a year for his services and a three years' engagement. Dr. Cockburn being on the other side of the Atlantic, Mr. Wicksteed has asked Mr. W. H. Cummings, the principal of the Guildhall School of Music, and Mr. Frederick Cliffe, of the Royal College of Music, Kensington, to assist the doctor to make the selection on his return, and both have expressed their willingness to do so.
Touching the matter of the modern history professorship and this musical appointment, I learn that the forms for the respective candidates to fill up, which were sent from Adelaide by the same mail as the Agent-General's instructions, have not yet arrived. In the case of the University professorship, advertisements relating to which have already appeared, and applications for forms are now coming in fast, the delay is rather awkward, and if the forms do not turn up in a day or so there will be nothing for it but to have them reprinted here.
In the case of the musical appointment there is no particular reason for haste, as the selected candidate is not required to be in Adelaide before the beginning of March, and the appointment will be definitely made by Dr. Cockburn and his colleagues. In the other case, as the final selection rests with the University council, and the selected man is required to be in Adelaide by April 1, there is no time to cut to waste.
