## ANCIENT ITALIAN MOSAICS.

Last night, in the Prince of Wales Theatre of the Adelaide University, Dr. Hodgkin, F.R.S., a celebrated English Quaker and scholar, delivered a lecture on the subject, "Ravenna and its Mosaics." There was a large attendance, including his Excellency the Deputy-Governor (Sir Samuel Way). The lecturer described the ancient glories of Ravenna, which, though now some distance from the sea, once had a marine suburb. An intellectual charm clung to Ravenna because of the fact that Dante spent his last days there, and that Byron wrote some of his poems under the inspiration of the historic pine wood of the town. Not only was the tomb of Dante at Ravenna, but the town preserved as did no other place the monuments of the downfall of the Roman Empire. During all the eventful centuries when Rome and other cities of the West were being trodden down by barbarians, Ravenna remained as a kind of ark, and that was the reason why its churches were so Byzantine in character. He gave a vivid description of the mosaics to be seen in two of the ancient churches of the place, and referred to the tomb of Theodoric, the King who strove to preserve the Roman Empire on a barbarian basis.

At the conclusion of the lecture Dr. Hodgkin was heartily thanked, at the instance of Professor Darnley Naylor.

## RAVENNA AND ITS MOSAICS.

On Friday evening Dr. Hodgkin, F.R.S., delivered an interesting lecture on "Ravenna and its mosaics" in the Prince of Wales Theatre of the University to a large audience. The Chancellor (Sir Samuel Way, Bart.) presided. The lecturer described the ancient glories of Ravenna, which was once near the sea, but now was far away from the coast. It had an intellectual charm in that it was the place where Byron spent two years of his life and wrote one or two of his most beautiful works. Dante ended his storm-tossed life in the town, and was buried there. The unique and peculiar association with Ravenna was that it preserved as no other place did the monument of the downfall of the Roman Empire. During all these eventful centuries, when Rome and other cities of the West were being trodden down by barbarians, it remained as a kind of ark. In graphic language the lecturer described the churches of Ravenna and their beautiful mosaics, which mostly depicted religious subjects. The enjoyment of the lecture was much enhanced by some capital lantern slides. At the close Professor Darnley Naylor, in a graceful speech, expressed the appreciation of the audience.
