RHODES SCHOLARS.

Dr. Parkin, of Waterloo place, London, S.W., on behalf of the Rhodes Trust, has forwarded to us a statement for 1906-7 in reference to the operation of the Rhodes Scholarship scheme. The whole number of scholars at the beginning of the October term, 1907, was 160. Of these 157 were in actual residence. Three were temporarily absent on account of illness or for purposes of special study. They are distributed among the colleges of the university as follows:—Fourteen at Balliol, 14 at Christ Church, 12 at Queen's, 11 each at New College, and St. John's, 10 each at Exeter, Worcester, and Merton, 9 at Oriel, 8 at Magdalen, 7 each at Hertford, University, Wadham, and Trinity, 6 each at Brasenose and Lincoln, 5 at Pembroke, 2 each at Corpus and Jesus, and 1 each at Keble and St. Edmund Hall. Twenty-eight new scholars were elected and entered into residence in October, 1906. Of these six were from Australia, eight from Canada, five from South Africa, one each from Bermuda, Jamaica, Newfoundland, and New Zealand, and five from Germany. No scholars from the United States were elected for 1906. For 1907 73 scholars were elected, 45 of whom were from the United States, eight from Canada, six from Australia, five from South Africa, five from Germany, and one each from Bermuda, Jamaica, Newfoundland, and New Zealand. Three States of the American Union failed

to supply qualified candidates. The three scholarships provided for Rhodesia were not taken up. The work of the scholars now in residence is distributed as follows over the different courses of study organized in the university:—Literae Humaniores, 24; modern history, 18; jurisprudence, 30; natural science (geology, chemistry, physics, and physics), 20; English literature, 9; theology, 10; mathematics, 4; modern languages, 4; reading for a pass degree, 1. In courses more or less specialized or advanced than those for the B.A. degree there are reading.—For the B.C.L. degree, 11; for the B.Sc. degree, 6; for the B.Litt. degree, 3; for medicine, 3; for diploma in economics, 8; for forestry, 1; for research in chemistry, 1; for reading law generally, 2. Among the distinctions gained by scholars during the year were:—H. J. Rose (Quebec, 1904).—Chancellor's prize for Latin essay; elected official fellow at Exeter College. J. C. V. Behan (Victoria, 1904).—Appointed law lecturer at University College. W. A. Barton (New South Wales, 1904).—Vinerian Law Scholarship, £80 per annum, for three years. R. L. Robinson (South Australia, 1905).—Burdett-Coutts Scholarship in natural science, £115 per annum for two years. J. A. Thomson (New Zealand, 1904).—Appointed lecturer in natural science at St. John's College. Henry Hinds (North Dakota, 1904).—Demonstrator to assist the professor of geology for 1906-7. J. L. Walker (Western Australia, 1904).—Bacon Scholarship at Gray's Inn, £45 per annum for two years.
