THE ALEXANDER CLARK
MEMORIAL.

From W. H. Leaney:—"Some little time ago the Alexander Clark Memorial Prize was competed for at the Conservatorium of Music; and, although the result has not yet been published, seeing that one of the conditions is that every candidate must have been a pupil at one of the State schools for a period of not less than two years, between the ages of 11 and 16, I would like to suggest to those responsible for its establishment that the winner's name of this and every succeeding year should be placed on an 'honour tablet' in every State school of South Australia. This would serve a two-fold purpose. In the first place the memory of that gifted musician and the organizer of the thousand-voices concerts would be perpetuated day by day and for ever in the minds of those who have attended, are attending, and will attend the State schools of South Australia. Secondly, it would add a little of the atmosphere and spirit of emulation to the children of the State schools, which now seems so sadly lacking, but of which much has been made in the public school life of Old England, and the shades of which have fallen somewhat on the great private (public) schools of South Australia."

UNIVERSITY SENATE.

At a meeting of the Senate of the University of Adelaide on Wednesday, March 24, an election will be held to fill a vacancy on the Council created by the resignation of Mr. F. W. Young, LL.B. (now Agent-General). There are three candidates—Mr. W. R. Bayly, B.A., B.Sc. (head master of Price Alfred College), the Hon. Angus Parsons, LL.B. (Attorney General), and Mr. T. Ryan. At the Senate Meeting Professor Kerr Grant will move—"That a sub-committee (members to be nominated) be appointed to draft a schedule of rules for the guidance of the returning officer under the method of proportional representation adopted by the Senate meeting of July 22, 1914."

THIS YEAR'S EXTENSION LECTURES

The success of the extension lectures system in the past has induced the University authorities to continue the series this year. Professor Henderson, Dr. J. C. Verco, and Professor Rennie will be the lecturers, and each will deliver three addresses. Professor Henderson will speak on "Shakespeare's home and homeland," Dr. Verco on "Romance in medicine," and Professor Rennie on "The complexity of apparent simplicity in chemistry." The first lecture will be given in June in Adelaide. The country programme will be ready in about a week.
