UNIVERSITY COMMEMORATION.

THE YEAR'S ACTIVITIES.

Commemoration day at the University has been aborn of the boisterous exuberance which once marked the efforts of students to celebrate the completion of their finals. In days gone by tradition prescribed a certain levity which has long disappeared, and dignity was the keynote of the proceedings on Wednesday afternoon. There was the customary large gathering in the Elder Hall, but in the very atmosphere there was a difference so striking as in the assemblage itself. The change has been attributable in no small measure to the war. The words "in absentia" indicated how some of the youthful spirits, have employed their energies since the call of the Motherland, and indeed the sacrifices made by so many former undergrads tinged the function with a sad yet glorious glow. It was in that strain that the Chancellor (Sir George Murray) spoke most feelingly in his address. Associated with him on the platform were His Excellency Sir Henry Galway, the Vice-Chancellor (Professor Mitchell), and the deans of the various faculties. The audience included Lady Galway, Miss d'Erlanger, Capt. d'Erlanger, and Mr. Legh Winsor. A notable departure from the order which has been maintained since 1838 was the revival of an annual address by one of the professors, and it fell to Professor Rennie to discourse on "The development of chemistry in connection with the war," a report of which is published elsewhere.

—Outlook of the Future.—

In welcoming His Excellency, the Chancellor recalled that a year ago it was hoped that peace would favour the present commemoration, but in spite of the heroic efforts and splendid achievements of their soldiers and sailors the outlook was darker than ever before. The time had come for great sacrifices without pause, even to the death. His Excellency had perceived this at the outbreak of hostilities. The people of Australia were only now awakening to it. But the Governor had never doubted the issue of the war, and it was to be hoped that just as his prescience proved true, so would his faith be rewarded.

A Change of Programme.—

Touching on the programme of the past year's work, the Chancellor explained that the extension lectures had been supplanted by a series on a different plan, which Lady Galway had begun with an address on modern languages. The valuable information and stimulating suggestions which the lectures had given should be closely studied by all interested in the advancement of South Australia. An important development during the year was the inauguration of tutorial classes under the auspices of the Workers' Educational Society. The numbers who had joined the classes formed by Mr. Heaton, Professor Daruley Naylor, and Miss E. Jackson in economics, the modern State, English literature, and psychology had disclosed a widespread desire for higher education among working people and those engaged in domestic duties. It was to be hoped that the demand would be met by a further extension of these lectures.

—A Year of Sacrifice.—

The effect of the war was naturally the subject of special mention, especially so far as concerned many of the prominent members of the University who had seen active service. During the year 43 old students had been accepted by the military authorities, making a total of 349 who had enlisted. (Applause.) One in every 10 had given his life, two in 12 had been wounded, and two of them were prisoners of war. Lieut.-Col. W. T. Hayward, who for a considerable time had been in charge of the Australian Hospital at Harefield, had been succeeded by another South Australian graduate in Dr. C. Yeatman, and had been created a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George. Lieut.-Col. de Crespigny had received the D.S.O., and Capt. B. B. Bayley, whose death they had to lament, Capt. J. R. S. G. Beard, J. B. Birch, R. L. Kenihan, D. McDonald Steele, F. L. Wall, and H. A. Wylie, and Lieuts. W. J. Denny and D. Yates had gained the high honour of the Military Cross, a bar to which had also been won by Capt. Gordon Campbell. Sap. L. W. McNamara had received a Military Medal, and Lieut.-Col. H. A. Powell had been mentioned in despatches. To the relatives of those who had fallen, and to the wounded he extended the sincerest and most respectful sympathy in behalf of the University. To Sgt. H. W. Gartrell, their lecturer on mining engineering, and others who were about to leave for the front, he wished godspeed and a safe and glorious return, while he heartily welcomed Dr. F. Goldsmith, who went with the 1st Contingent, and returned only the previous day.

—A University Pioneer.—

An event which had caused the University deep regret during the past few weeks, had been the decision of the Rev. J. Jeffers, LL.D., to withdraw from membership of the council on account of advancing age. He would be remembered by all who had been associated with him with genuine affection, and in the history of the University it would be recorded of him that he had used his influence successfully to secure a transfer of the £20,000, which Sir Walter Watson Hughes intended to devote to the founding of a college for the training of ministers of religion. That fund was diverted for the establishment of a University to benefit the whole community. Their hope was that Dr. Jeffers would enjoy many years of health and happiness in the retirement which he had so well earned.

CHEMISTRY AND THE

WAR.

The Lesson of Preparedness.

The development of chemistry in connection with the present war gave occasion for an illuminating address by Professor Rennie at the annual commemoration of the Adelaide University on Wednesday. He pointed out that contradictory statements had repeatedly been made about the part German chemists had played in the tremendous development of applied chemistry which had taken place in the past 20 or 30 years. On the one hand it was said that German chemists had been chiefly remarkable for their skill in adapting to their own purposes ideas derived from external sources; on the other that the initiative had been with them, and that the British chemists were to blame for lack of enterprise, if not lack of skill due to defective training. Of course, neither statements contained the whole truth. Germany had produced many great chemists whose names would always be found in the first rank of scientific investigations, but so had Britain, France, and America.
