SCIENCE AND THE VINE.

University Professor's Eulogium.

"One of Greatest Pleasures."

In proposing the toast of the South Australian Vinegrowers' Association, at the annual dinner of that body, on Wednesday evening, Professor T. G. B. Osborn, of the Adelaide University, in cultured vein, said his association with viticulturists in South Australia had had most to do with pests "that spoiled your summer fields and fruitful vines."

Shield the young harvest from devouring blight, The smut's dark poison, and the mildew white; Deep-rooted mould and ergot's horn uncouth And break the canker's desolating tooth.

They knew better than he, continued the Professor, the value to the State of the important industry they represented. There were few crops indeed, whose average per acre amounted to over £48 as theirs did in 1920-21. But the imposing sum of £1,354,533, that represented the total estimated value of the yield, was not the only benefit that South Australia derived from their industry.

Vast Fields of Promise.

But close settlement and small holdings might suffer from this disadvantage, observed the professor, they tended to develop in their population a lack of co-operation, a feeling of suspicion among neighbours. Such areas might become backwaters removed from the swift stream of advancing knowledge.
