THE AUSTRALIA.

UNIVERSITIES TO HAVE THE MACHINERY.

A WRANGLE IN SYDNEY.

It does not appear that the Adelaide University or the School of Mines will receive a share of H.M.A.S. Australia's machinery. The Sydney University and the Sydney Technical College each claims to have been promised certain parts.

The announcement by the Acting Prime Minister (Dr. Earle Page) that the utilisation of H.M.A.S. Australia as a breakwater would be a technical infringement of the Washington Naval Disarmament Treaty has definitely blighted the hopes of Brighton and Coff's Harbor (New South Wales). Notwithstanding its refusal to the Brighton Council, the Coff's Harbor Municipal authorities made a strong claim for the hull. Had their persistence been rewarded a good deal of dismay would have been caused at Brighton, where the suggestion of using the battle cruiser as a breakwater was first mooted.

Naturally, difficulty would have been experienced in putting such a breakwater into position as the hull, riding light, would not draw much water and could be filled with concrete or other ballast. As a matter of fact the scheme was suggested to Brighton by a university professor who considered such a breakwater would render useful service for many years. Instead of coming to this practical end the historic vessel, it now appears to be certain to be towed to sea and sunk, possibly by gun practice.

The disposal of the hull, however, still leaves the machinery to be dealt with. The Washington Treaty does not require this to be a water grave, and most of it is now piled up at Garden Island. Except for the 40,000 h.p. turbines all of it would be welcomed by the universities and technical colleges, and it is understood that it is to be offered to them. Apparently steps have been taken regarding the distribution but so far Adelaide has not been mentioned. Even Melbourne may have to act quickly, for the Sydney University and the Sydney Technical College are already wrangling over the possession of certain portions. Both institutions claim to have been promised them, and as the State Premier is unable to settle the matter, it has been referred to the Federal authorities for decision.

Asked what share the Adelaide University would get, the Registrar (Mr. C. R. Hodge) replied that no communication had been received that the machinery was available but he thought it should prove a valuable addition to the engineering school. Professor Mitchell replied that it would be useful to both the University and the School of Mines, and Sir Douglas Maxwell agreed that much of the equipment, provided the Navy Department did not retain the best of it for its own purposes, would be of practical value.

The dispute in Sydney speaks volumes regarding the utility of the old ship's hull, and possibly it may not be too late to secure some of it for Adelaide.

THE FINAL SCENE.

Sydney, November 21.

It is now taken as definite that the battle cruiser Australia will be sunk and thus rendered non-effective, as decreed by the Washington Treaty. Suggestions have been made that this should be made the occasion of a spectacular ceremony while the British fleet is in Australian waters, but the time by which the Australia must be destroyed expires more than a month before the visiting warboats are due. Accordingly the Australia will probably be taken direct east of Sydney to the 100 fathoms line, and in the presence of only the Commonwealth navy sunk in the deep.

The reasons why the Cabinet decided that it would be impracticable to use the battle cruiser as a breakwater were mentioned by the naval officials. The engineering difficulties in the way of placing the Australia in the exact position desired were considered to be too great. If the vessel sank out of position it would be practically impossible to shift her 10,000 tons of dead weight. Another reason was that the Australia could not provide a permanent breakwater. If plates would be used, and the gradual process of disintegration would ensue, so that instead of a protection such a breakwater would be a great menace.
