LEVEE AT GOVERNMENT HOUSE.

THE GOVERNOR PRESENTS MEDALS.

His Excellency the Governor held a levee at Government House on Tuesday, in honor of the King's Birthday, and many citizens attended to give evidence of their loyalty to the Crown. After the reception the Governor presented several long-service medals to military officers.

The weather on Tuesday was not propitious for the holding of open-air gatherings, and his Excellency the Governor, Sir Tom Bridges, held the King's Birthday levee in the reception room at Government House. Though a chilly north wind made people shiver and raised dust in the streets, the grounds of Government House presented an arcadian scene, where the wind was tempered, and trees, lawns, and flowers bore little sign of the advance of winter. The assemblage, though not so large as on some former occasions, was representative, and the naval and military uniforms, with the academic robes of members of the University of Adelaide, relieved the sombreness of the prescribed morning dress which was chiefly worn by those present.

A guard of honor was provided by the 7th Battalion of senior cadets, under the command of Captain E. G. Kelly and Lieutenants Roach and Seaton, and the 10th Battalion band, under Sergeant T. Bollen, provided music.

On the stroke of noon, and as the sound of the first discharge of the Royal Salute echoed on the Parade Ground reverberated amongst the buildings of the city, his Excellency the Governor, attended by Captain Colin Duncan (private secretary), Captain Hambleton, A.D.C., Major Clowes, Captain Dowlen, and Lieutenant Macquarie, extra-

His Excellency the Governor.

A.D.C.s stepped from the main entrance of Government House under the porchway and on to the lawn, where the guard was drawn up. The cadets were very steady in parade, and gave the salute with admirable precision. The band played "God save the King," and then the Governor returned to the levee and took up his station in the reception-room, where the citizens filed past and shook hands. When the ceremony was over his Excellency again stepped on to the lawn, accompanied by the Lieutenant-Governor (Sir George Murray), the Premier (Hon. J. Gunn), the Chief Secretary (Hon. J. Jelley), the District Naval Officer (Lieutenant-Commander Young), and the Military Base Commander (Major Hoad). His Excellency again took the salute and inspected the guard, chatting pleasantly with many of the cadets. He then presented the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration (V.D.) to Brigadier-General R. L. Leane, C.M.G., D.S.O., M.C. (Commissioner of Police), commanding the 3rd Infantry Brigade; Lieutenant-Colonel E. K. Baker, commanding the 10th Battalion; Lieutenant-Colonel H. H. Russell, A.A.M.C.; Lieutenant-Colonel W. N. Waite, D.S.O., M.C. (reserve of officers), and Major F. C. Siekmann (reserve of officers). The V.D. is given for 2 years' commissioned service with the colonial forces. His Excellency also presented to Colonel S. Roy Burston, C.B.E., D.S.O. (Deputy Director of Military Services, 4th Military District), the Long Service Medal.
