

THE LL.B. EXAMINATIONS.—Elsewhere we give the results of this year's examinations for the LL.B. degree. From these it will be seen that four students have passed for the first year, one for the second, and one for the third, while six have received certificates for passing in various portions of the course, one of the six having obtained the necessary number of marks in not less than four subjects. It will be noticed that Mr. Ash, M.F., has become especially well known to the Stow prize for having successfully undergone the test for the second year, and that Mr. F. L. Stow has achieved the unique honour of becoming the "Stow Scholar." This has been earned through having for three years in succession obtained the Stow prize. It is a noteworthy and gratifying fact that a son of the late distinguished Judge to whose memory the prize was instituted should be the first to attain this distinction.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS.—Since the publication of the results of this year's examinations at the Adelaide University a notice has been posted at the University to the effect that, in addition to passing the examination for the second year of the LL.B. course, Mr. George Ash obtained first-class honours in logic and second-class honours in Latin.
