THE ELDER CONSERVATORIUM.

A STUDENTS' CONCERT.

A delightful concert was given on Mon-  
day evening at the Elder Conservatorium  
by students, under the direction of  
Madame Delmar Hall, the occasion being  
a welcome to Mr. F. C. Bevan, of the  
Conservatorium, who recently returned  
from a visit to England. The items were  
all extremely well done, the best perhaps  
being a song cycle, "The mountebanks"  
(Easthope Martin), sung by Madame Del-  
mar Hall, Miss Gladys Michie, Mr. Fred  
Williamson, and Mr. Clive Carey. It was  
the first time this exquisite piece has  
been heard in Australia, and it was sent  
out to Madam Hall from England by Mr.  
Robert Quilter, the well-known composer,  
as being particularly suited for such a  
concert. It was well received, and each  
solo had to be given twice. Specially  
pleasing was the song, "Jingle hat," by  
Madame Hall, who was given enthusiastic  
applause. Another fine item was the  
opening quintet, "All is prepared," from

Appointment Considered Likely

During the past few months members  
of the legal profession have been discussing  
the question of the probable appointment  
of a fifth judge. It is recognised that  
there is serious congestion in the business  
before the court.

Mr. Justice Parsons has been away on  
holiday since April, and it is understood  
that he will not resume his duties until  
the end of the summer vacation, some-  
where about next April.

Mr. Acting Justice Richards, who was  
appointed when the Chief Justice went  
on leave last year, is continuing in his  
absence.

Legislation is necessary to provide for  
the appointment of a fifth judge. Al-  
though no announcement has been made  
it is significant that two rooms formerly

occupied by the Probate and Succession  
Duties Department have been vacated,  
and are being redecorated.

If a fifth judge is appointed it is gen-  
erally believed in legal circles that Mr.  
Acting Judge Richards will be given the  
position.

The next judge to take long leave is Mr.  
Justice Poole, and it is understood that he  
will take a well-earned holiday almost at  
once. In that event another acting judge  
must be appointed if the number of mem-  
bers of the Bench is increased to five.

Two prominent legal men have been  
mentioned as likely to be appointed, and  
they are Mr. H. F. Paine, S.M., and Mr.  
W. Stuart (Master of the Supreme Court).

There is a precedent for the elevation  
of the master to the Bench, for the late  
Mr. Justice Buchanan was master when  
he was appointed acting judge several  
years ago. Later he was appointed per-  
manently.

DOCTOR OF LETTERS

Rev. G. H. Wright Honored

PERTH, Today.  
The Senate of the University of Western  
Australia has conferred the degree of  
Doctor of Letters on the Rev. G. H.  
Wright, of Adelaide, a former student of  
the University of Western Australia, for  
his thesis on "The Spirit of Tragedy."

Mr. George F. Dodwell, B.A. (Govern-  
ment Astronomer), who left for England  
about six months ago to place before the  
British Government a discovery he had  
made which he considered would prove of  
great value to shipping, is expected to re-  
turn to Adelaide by the Orana on De-  
cember 18. Writing to a friend in Ade-  
laide he mentioned that he had spent a  
week-end in Paris with Gen. Ferris, a per-  
sonal friend of his, who is the director of  
wireless telegraphy in Paris. The general  
entertained Mr. Dodwell at the  
Inter-Allied Club. Mr. Dodwell has spent  
much time at the Royal Observatory in  
Greenwich, and has also attended meet-  
ings of the Royal Institution, and the  
Royal Astronomical Association.

EVIL OF SLAVERY

Address by Mr. W. Oldham

New Zealand was the first country to  
bring the evil of slavery under the  
notice of the League of Nations. Mr.  
W. Oldham, M.A., Lecturer in History  
at Adelaide University, who addressed  
members of the League of Nations  
Union on "Slavery and the League" at  
the weekly luncheon today, traced the  
history of slavery from Roman times to  
the present day.

Information on the subject was secured  
from 48 countries. This showed that it  
is only one Christian State, namely, Aby-  
ssinia, was slavery legally recognised.

Slave raiding was said to be rare, al-  
though it was still continued in the  
Sahara by nomadic tribes. The slave  
trade was forbidden in all territories con-  
trolled by the League of Nations. Never-  
theless it was known in various forms,  
from concubinage to serfdom. In this  
latter form the slave suffered little,  
nevertheless he was born and died in  
a condition of slavery.

A slave dhow containing slaves from  
Abyssinia was captured in the Mediter-  
ranean as late as 1922. A commission  
of eight experts met in 1924 to consider  
the question. Its report dealt with  
domestic slavery, slave dealing, and  
compulsory labor. All these were four  
to exist, either legally or illegally.
