The mean square for B x 0 x W is the variance for error 0.2050, corresponding to a S.D. 0.45 in the units used for reduced deflexion. This as you say is high on the range of numbers scored. The last 4 items show no differences sufficiently great to be judged significant, though two of them suggestionly bigger than begay (0.2050). The striking mann count of word 88, may show the kind of thing that is happening.
