- I) What a teaser to ask me the date of birth of Thomas Bayes. I seem to refer to everything else about him. However, I have just been shown a letter I wrote in 1953 to the "Dictionary of National Biography" pointing out that this important writer had been omitted, and in this letter, perhaps correctly, I did give the date of his birth as 1697. Anyway, you could bet heavily that it was within a year or two of this date.
