I am glad to hear about the book, as I knew Williams and Norgate were trying to get a cheap introductory book out, and I think you are the right man to do it.

Although one cannot explain at once the small sample procedures, yet the first numerical examples will always in fact be small sample problems, for the sake of simplicity, so that it will be necessary to explain right early that the large sample procedure is inadequate, while postponing a statement of what is to replace it.

In the next edition I have decided to replace the Appendix at the end of Chapter III, by a statement of the  $\mathcal{K}$ -statistics which are so much more comprehensive and useful than the moments. If you like I will send a note of the new appendix, so that you can see the notation, which it is to everyone's advantage to keep uniform.
